### MONTOURSVILLE MEMORIAL GROUNDS BRIEF BACKGROUND AND PLAN FOR RENOVATIONS SEPTEMBER 2021

The Montoursville Memorial Grounds was completed in 1999. Funds for construction were donated after the Flight 800 disaster. The site is now twenty-two years old. When the project was completed, a three member Perpetual Care Committee was created and empowered to meet periodically to insure the site was maintained and to oversee the perpetual care funds. Since the property is jointly owned by the Borough of Montoursville and the Montoursville Area School District, each body designates on a yearly basis a representative to serve on the committee. The third member is to be a member of the community. The community member has been Bob Weaver since 1999. He was also part of the original construction committee as a parent representative.

After completion approximately \$25,000 remained from the original construction budget of \$125,000. A perpetual care fund was created and is held by the School District. In the early 2000's interest rate was 5% and the interest income was sufficient to cover the costs of maintenance. Since we have not seen 5% interest rates since, the principal has been used for maintenance of the site and has gradually been depleted. The balance today is approximately \$19,505.11. Within the past three months we received a donation of \$10,000 and another donation of \$1,000 that are reflected in this balance.

Maintenance costs over the years have consisted of a maintenance contract with Ettinger's Landscaping to maintain and prune shrubbery, occasional shrub replacement and mulch. This years cost was \$2,867.20 for maintenance.

After twenty two years the site is in need of attention. The lawn needs restored and Ettinger's has volunteered to weed and feed the lawn at no cost. The maple trees have heaved the brick walk in numerous spots to the point it is a tripping hazard and liability. There are too many areas to make repair cost effective and even with repair the condition will continue. The hemlock trees along the east and west property lines are diseased and dying. They will not survive. Numerous hemlock trees have already been removed. When they were planted originally in 1999, they were a good choice but not today. The holly bushes along north and south borders died this year and have been removed. Major renovations are needed.

Over the past few months the perpetual care committee has met to consider options and plot strategy. Scott Konkle has represented the School District. Mayor Steve Bagwell has represented the Borough. Bob Weaver has been the community member. Chuck Grimm has assisted with the committee work and Brandy Smith has called the meetings. Wayne Ettinger has joined us as consultant. His expertise has been invaluable.

Ettinger's has offered a plan for proposed renovations. The high points include:

- Removal of the brick walk and construction of a new walk of concrete pavers. The walk will be moved inward by about twenty feet to eliminate the possibility tree roots will heave it in the future.
- Removal of the hemlock trees along east and west property lines. Replacement with emerald green arborvitae. These trees will not need pruned and will provide a similar screen effect. Place river gravel ground cover.

Removal of the mulch around the maple trees and placement of pachysandra ground cover. Grass
will not grow beneath the maple trees so a permanent ground cover will be placed. The ground
cover will eliminate the cost for mulch on a yearly basis.

### Costs for renovations:

- 1. Walk \$79,000
- 2. Arborvitae and stone east and west property lines \$14,900
- Pachysandra ground cover \$28,000 Total \$121,900

The Perpetual Care Committee recommends approval of this plan for renovations. Approval of both the Montoursville Borough Council and Montoursville Area School District Board of Directors is requested.

The next step will be to plan a fundraising campaign. We have an anonymous donor who will commit \$25,000 toward the walk but with the understanding all funds are in place. We request both the Council and District consider allocating funds toward the project. Ideally the campaign will occur over the next six months and construction commence in 2022. Ettinger's will be the contractor.

In the event not all funds are raised, the highest priority will be the walk, followed by the arborvitae screen and lastly the ground cover at the maple trees.

Attached to this report is a site plan prepared by Ettinger's showing the improvements as well as a proposal with cost estimates for those improvements. The proposal contains additional details and specifics on construction techniques.

### **ARP-American Rescue Plan IDEA 21-22**

IDEA Agreement-Project # 062-22-0-017—CFDA #84.027 Federal Award # H027X210093

This Agreement entered into this 1st day of July, 2021, by and between the Board of Education of Bradford, Lycoming, Sullivan and Tioga (BLaST) Intermediate Unit #17, hereinafter called ("BLaST"), and Montoursville Area School District hereinafter called ("School District").

### Background

BLaST, on the first day of July 1999, entered into a Contract with the Department of Education of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, hereinafter called ("Department"). BLaST agreed to furnish all certified personnel, facilities, materials and other services (in consultation with the Department) needed to perform the services described in the Grant Agreement and to comply with the terms and conditions of the Grant Agreement and the Department's most current IDEA Application Guidelines, which contract, grant agreements, and guidelines are set forth as Exhibit 1 of this Agreement and are hereby incorporated by reference into this Agreement.

The Department has authorized BLaST to enter into an Agreement with the School District whereby the furnishing of all certified personnel, facilities, materials and other services (in consultation with the Department) needed to perform the services described in Grant Agreement and compliance with the terms and conditions of the Grant Agreement and the Department's most current IDEA Application Guidelines set forth in Exhibit 1 will be the sole obligations of the School District and will no longer be a responsibility of BLaST. BLaST has determined that the estimated IDEA allocation for the School District is \$75,575 as set forth in Exhibit 2 which is hereby incorporated by reference into this Agreement. The said funds must be used to

supplement the provision of special educational and related services for eligible school age children as set forth in Exhibit 3 which is hereby incorporated by reference into this contract.

### Witnesseth

In Consideration of the mutual covenants, and intending to be legally bound, the parties hereto agree as follows:

- BLaST hereby agrees to transfer the funds (estimated) set forth in Exhibit 2 to the School District to be administered in accordance with Exhibits 1 and 3 of this Agreement.
- The School District agrees to accept the funds set forth in Exhibit 2 and to comply
  with the provisions set forth in Exhibits 1 and 3 of this Agreement.
- 3. The School District agrees and assumes sole responsibility for compliance with all of the terms and conditions set forth in Exhibits 1 and 3 of this Agreement. Upon the execution of this Agreement, the School District consents to a delegation of all duties and responsibilities imposed upon BLaST as set forth in Exhibits 1 and 3, and BLaST is hereby relieved of any and all responsibility for compliance with the terms and conditions of Exhibits 1 and 3 and the duties and responsibilities set forth therein.
- 4. The undersigned authorized representatives of the School District hereby certify that the School District's governing body has adopted the terms of this Agreement and has authorized the undersigned in its behalf to enter into this Agreement.
- 5. Upon execution of this Agreement, the School District herby agrees to indemnify and save and hold harmless BLaST, members of the Board, officers, agents, servants, and employees from any loss, liability, damages, costs (including, without being limited to, court costs or administrative proceedings, and in the amount of any judgment, award, or decision) and expenses (including, but without being limited to, counsel fees) reasonably paid or incurred in connection with any civil action, administrative proceeding, or arbitration proceeding instituted against BLaST, members of the Board, officers, agents, servants, and employees, arising

from duties performed by School District hereunder of from the payment or administration by BLaST of the District IDEA allocations

The School District agrees that the foregoing is intended to be as broad and inclusive as is permitted by the law of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, and that if any portion thereof is held invalid, it is agreed that the balance shall; notwithstanding, continue in full legal force and effect.

The parties hereto, intending to be legally bound hereby, execute this Agreement the 1st day of July 2021.

### E. Allowable/Unallowable Costs

Allowable/Unallowable Costs

Costs must be: necessary, reasonable, allocable, and documented.

**Guiding questions:** 

- Is the cost reasonable and necessary for the program?
- Do sound business practices support the expenditure?
- Does the expense support the purpose of the grant?
- Is the expense in compliance with laws, regulations, and grant terms?
- Is the price comparable to that of similar goods or services in the geographic area?
- Is the purchase for excess cost of educating students with disabilities?

For a particular cost to be allowed, it must be an excess cost of providing special education and related services for IDEA Part B.

Costs that are allowed can include, but may not be limited to, the following. However, every effort must be made to allocate ACCESS reimbursable costs to state or local funding whenever possible:

- Extended school year (ESY) programs including ESY transportation and ESY for students with disabilities placed out of state through the Special Education Plan Revision Process (SEPRN)
- Supplemental education costs to support the implementation of the Cordero court decision
- Training programs for parents, teachers and professionals/paraprofessionals who work with students with disabilities
- Occupational and physical therapy
- Hearing impaired services
- Vision impaired services
- Physically impaired services
- Audiology
- Assistive technology specialist
- Orientation and mobility specialists
- Psychiatrists (MD certified for SED)
- Adaptive physical education

- Work experience coordinator and job coaches
- Speech therapy
- Special education teachers
- Clerical staff directly working with allowable professional staff
- Teacher's aides or Paraprofessional personnel
- Bus aides
- Assistive devices
- Psychological services
- Social worker
- IEP specified nursing functions
- Program Monitoring and Evaluation
- Coordinated Early Intervening Services (optional -- available to school districts and public charter schools)

Costs that are not allowed can include, but may not be limited to, the following:

- Any expenditure made before the beginning date or after the ending date of an approved project
- School transportation (except for field trips, ESY transportation, etc.)
- Operational costs for school owned property (rent, heat, telephones)
- School administrators
- Construction
- Business costs
- Membership in organizations for individuals
- Travel expenses (except for project paid staff or attendance at project paid activities)
- Food, beverages or snacks (there is a high burden of proof, that paying for food, beverages or snacks with federal funds is necessary to meet the goals and objectives of a federal grant)
- Rental costs for IU programs housed in school district operated buildings
- Costs related to legal counsel and/or attorney fees

### MONTOURSVILLE AREA SCHOOL DISTRICT 2022-2023 Real Estate Tax Increase Resolution

WHEREAS, on June 27, 2006, the Pennsylvania legislature passed Act 1 of Special Session 2006, entitled the "Taxpayer Relief Act" (hereinafter "Act 1");

WHEREAS, Act 1 requires school districts to limit tax increases to the level set by an inflation index unless the tax increase is approved by voters in a referendum or the school district obtains from the Pennsylvania Department of Education or a court of common pleas certain referendum exceptions;

WHEREAS, Act 1 does, however, allow a board of school directors to elect to adopt a resolution indicating that it will not raise the rate of any tax for the support of the public schools for the following fiscal year by more than its index, provided this resolution must be adopted no later than 110 days prior to the date of the election immediately preceding the upcoming fiscal year;

WHEREAS, the Montoursville Area School District index for the 2022-2023 fiscal year is 4.4%;

WHEREAS, the Montoursville Area School District Board of School Directors has made the decision that it shall not raise the rate of any tax for the support of the Montoursville Area School District for the 2022-2023 fiscal year by more than its index.

AND NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Montoursville Area School District (hereinafter "District") Board of School Directors (hereinafter "Board") the following:

- 1. The Board certifies that it will not increase any school district tax for the 2022-2023 school year at a rate that exceeds the index as calculated by the Pennsylvania Department of Education.
- The Board certifies that it will comply with the procedures set forth in Section 687, of the Pennsylvania Public School Code (hereinafter "School Code"), 24 P.S. §6-687, for the adoption of its proposed and final budget.
- 3. The Board certifies that increasing any tax at a rate less than or equal to the index will be sufficient to balance its final budget of the 2022-2023 fiscal year.
- 4. The Administration of the District will submit the District's information on a proposed increase in the rate of a tax levied for the support of the District to the Pennsylvania Department of Education on the uniform form prepared by the Pennsylvania Department of Education no later than five days after the Board's adoption of this Resolution.

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- The Administration of the District will send a copy of this Resolution to the Pennsylvania Department of Education no later than five days after the Board's adoption of this Resolution.
- 6. The Board understands and agrees that by passing this Resolution it is not eligible to seek referendum exceptions under Section 333(f) of Act 1 and is not eligible to request approval from the voters through a referendum to increase a tax rate by more than the index as established for the 2022-2023 fiscal year.
- 7. Once this Resolution is passed, the Administration of the District is not required to comply with the preliminary budget requirements set forth in paragraphs (a) and (c) of Section 311 of Act 1. Provided, however:
  - (a) The Board understands and agrees that, upon receipt of the information submitted by the District as set forth in paragraphs 4 and 5 above, the Pennsylvania Department of Education shall compare the District's proposed percentage increase in the rate of the tax with the index.
  - (b) Within ten days of the receipt of this information, the Pennsylvania Department of Education shall inform the District whether its proposed tax rate increase is less than or equal to the index.
  - (c) If the Pennsylvania Department of Education determines that the District's proposed increase in the rate of the District's tax exceeds the index, the District is subject to the preliminary budget requirements as set forth in paragraph (a) and (c) of Section 311 of Act 1.

#### <u>Purpose</u>

The Board is committed to providing a safe, positive learning environment for district students. The Board recognizes that bullying creates an atmosphere of fear and intimidation, detracts from the safe environment necessary for student learning, and may lead to more serious violence. Therefore, the Board prohibits bullying by district students.

#### Definitions

**Bullying** means an intentional electronic, written, verbal or physical act or series of acts directed at another student or students, which occurs in a school setting

 $\{X\}$  and/or outside a school setting,

that is severe, persistent or pervasive and has the effect of doing any of the following: [1]

- 1. Substantially interfering with a student's education.
- 2. Creating a threatening environment.
- 3. Substantially disrupting the orderly operation of the school.

**Bullying**, as defined in this policy, includes cyberbullying.

**School setting** means in the school, on school grounds, in school vehicles, at a designated bus stop or at any activity sponsored, supervised or sanctioned by the school.[1]

#### <u>Authority</u>

The Board prohibits all forms of bullying by district students,[1]

The Board encourages students who believe they or others have been bullied to promptly report such incidents to the building principal or designee.

Students are encouraged to use the district's report form, available from the building principal, or to put the complaint in writing; however, oral complaints shall be accepted and documented. The person accepting the complaint shall handle the report objectively, neutrally and professionally, setting aside personal biases that might favor or disfavor the student filing the complaint or those accused of a violation of this policy.

The Board directs that verbal and written complaints of bullying shall be investigated promptly, and appropriate corrective or preventative action be taken when allegations are substantiated. The Board directs that any complaint of bullying brought pursuant to this policy shall also be reviewed for conduct which may not be proven to be bullying under this policy but merits review and possible action under other Board policies.

When a student's behavior indicates a threat to the safety of the student, other students, school employees, school facilities, the community or others, district staff shall report the student to the threat assessment team, in accordance with applicable law and Board policy. [2][3]

#### Title IX Sexual Harassment and Other Discrimination

Every report of alleged bullying that can be interpreted at the outset to fall within the provisions of policies addressing potential violations of laws against discrimination shall be handled as a joint, concurrent investigation into all allegations and coordinated with the full participation of the Compliance Officer and Title IX Coordinator. If, in the course of a bullying investigation, potential issues of discrimination are identified, the Title IX Coordinator shall be promptly notified, and the investigation shall be conducted jointly and concurrently to address the issues of alleged discrimination as well as the incidents of alleged bullying.[4][5]

#### Confidentiality

Confidentiality of all parties, witnesses, the allegations, the filing of a complaint and the investigation shall be handled in accordance with applicable law, regulations, this policy and the district's legal and investigative obligations.

#### Retaliation

Reprisal or retaliation relating to reports of bullying or participation in an investigation of allegations of bullying is prohibited and shall be subject to disciplinary action.

#### **Delegation of Responsibility**

Each student shall be responsible to respect the rights of others and to ensure an atmosphere free from bullying.

The Superintendent or designee shall develop administrative regulations to implement this policy.

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that this policy and administrative regulations are reviewed annually with students. [1]

The Superintendent or designee, in cooperation with other appropriate administrators, shall review this policy every three (3) years and recommend necessary revisions to the Board.[1]

District administration shall annually provide the following information with the Safe School Report: [1]

- Board's Bullying Policy.
- 2. Report of bullying incidents.
- Information on the development and implementation of any bullying prevention, intervention or education programs.

#### **Guidelines**

The Code of Student Conduct, which shall contain this policy, shall be disseminated annually to students. [1][6][7]

This policy shall be accessible in every classroom. The policy shall be posted in a prominent location within each school building and on the district website.[1]

develop, implement and evaluate bullying prevention and intervention programs and activities. Programs and activities shall provide district staff and students with appropriate training for effectively responding to, intervening in and reporting incidents of bullying.[1][8][9][10]

#### Consequences for Violations

A student who violates this policy shall be subject to appropriate disciplinary action consistent with the Code of Student Conduct, which may include: [1][6][11]

- 1.  $\{x\}$  Counseling within the school.

- 10.  $\{\underline{x}\}$  Referral to law enforcement officials.
