Over the past couple of weeks, I have had extensive one on one discussion with the members of the board who have been in favor of the current building project to discuss what our next step should be. I would like to share the results of those discussions with you.

The results of a primary election do not change the make-up of the current sitting board, nor do they ensure the make-up of a future board. That can only happen after the general election. As current elected members of the board, we feel that we are still charged with making decisions based on extensive research and based on what we believe to be in the best interest of the students and the community.

With that said, the current board feels that it is in the best interest of the community to continue with the building project as scheduled. The reasons for that belief are as follows:

- We have some serious concerns both structurally and functionally with the existing high school. When we first started talking to the architects, we told them the existing 1931 structure had to be part of any plan they come up with. We soon found out that repairing the structure along with bringing the educational space up to current best practices brought the cost well over our intended budget.
- 2. 7 of the 9 board members have been vigorously pursuing a 3.6 million dollar cost saving through the Pennsylvania plan con process. We have every reason to believe that that any future ability to obtain money from this program will end in just 21 days. A cancellation or any significant changes to this project will come at a cost of 3.6 million dollars. We do not want to create a situation where a future board will have to make almost 4 million dollars in cuts in order to make any project affordable.
- 3. 7 of the 9 members of this board have vigorously persued a 2 million dollar grant which we recently learned we have been awarded for this project. There are costs involved with the

- grant, but it still represents at least a 1 million dollar net gain for the district. This grant is no longer available for future applications. We received the last of the available funds.

  Abandoning this grant will put future boards in a position of having to find an additional million dollars in cuts in order to make any project affordable.
- 4. Bond interest rates are at historic lows but have been projected to increase in the very near future. Any delay in this project will surely cost the district additional money in the form of higher interest rates. We are expecting the bonds to be issued at rates under the amount that we have budgeted for this project.
- 5. With a rebounding economy, construction costs are expected to increase in the near future. At the end of the last recession, construction costs skyrocketed in a very short period of time.
- 6. In addition to the needs of the high school there are also some significant needs at Loyalsock Valley Elementary School. It is not the opinion of the board that the high school needs are more important and we are fully aware that the Valley has some serious issues that need addressed in very short order. Before committing a significant investment into the Valley we had to first make sure that there was a reliable source of water at that site. We have recently invested in a new well there that is producing plenty of water and we expect to hear tonight that it has finally received all of it necessary regulatory approvals. A decision was made to tackle the high school project first merely because the dollar cost of that project is significantly higher. Because of the financial considerations I just discussed, we felt we had to take advantage of those savings on the higher dollar item. We are planning on using the savings through the plan con process, grants, and lower bond interest rates to make necessary improvements and repairs to the Valley.
  - 7. Doing nothing is not an option. Making quick inexpensive patches to the high school is not an option. We are convinced that there are major issues that require a significant investment.

Although none of us like to spend money or increase taxes, we feel that delaying this project and kicking the can down the road can only result in significant increased cost to the district.

We have received comments that we are not listening to the community. I want to assure you that you have been heard. While some of you may not agree with our actions and do not believe we have been responsive, please know that your comments have encouraged all of us to look over the current plans in great detail and consider any other options that might be available to us. Speaking for myself, I am even more convinced than before that we are making the right choice. As I consider other options, the only viable choice that I can support is to continue with option 5.

There have been efforts by the option 6 candidates to disrupt our plans. The candidates actually distributed a letter at our pre-bid conference in an effort to decrease the number of bidders and therefor increase the cost of the project. The board members sympathetic to their cause have voted against applying for any grants and have even gone as far as voting against an effort to refinance existing debt. All in an effort to increase the costs to the district. We have been informed that efforts will be made to increase our bond costs and to challenge our actions legally which will clearly result in significant legal fees to the school district. We respectfully request that any and all efforts to increase the cost of this project be curtailed.

I know that members of the community will be concerned about the direction we are taking. We are committed to providing the community with accurate facts regarding this project. Unfortunately, due to unforeseen circumstances, we have had to cancel some information sessions about this project. Please know that we are working to get some information sessions scheduled in the near future.
