### 1931 Building Discussion

Mrs. Bason and Mr. Castner met with the borough to discuss options for the 1931 building. They learned permits would be required for anything the district decides to do and construction documents must be provided by a

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licensed architect. If it is not educational use, it is zoned as residential township. The building would have to be brought up to international code. If the building is demolished at a later date the district would need a permit. Moneys are available through the community and economical development but grants take time and strategies. Mr. Castner commented that anything we do has to meet present zoning. Mrs. Bason commented on the electrical panel, that was to be moved to the 1931 building, back to the district office. Mr. Castner commented that it would be temporary to supply power to the district office.

Discussion was opened up for board discussion. Mrs. Marriott commented we do not have anyone interested. Mrs. Wright asked if we do nothing and put no money into the building. Mrs. Marriott responded we would still have to heat the building. Mr. Ruffing commented there is no such thing as putting no money into it. Mrs. Wright commented on the cost to demo the building. Mrs. Bason and Mr. Castner responded that if we demoed the building now we would not need to get another permit. Mrs. Marriott asked the purpose of leaving the building and for how long. Mrs. Wright responded the building is an asset and once it is gone it is gone. Mrs. Marriott commented we have had 16 plus months and still no purpose for the building. Mr. Ruffing commented it is an asset when it has a use, if it does not have a use it is a liability. Mr. Ruffing commented on the Davison Report and the studies done on the building. Mr. Konkle commented that being in the new board meeting room is awesome.

Mr. Konkle commented about what the Davison Report reported on the building. Mrs. Johns wanted to know what the big rush is to tear down the building and asked if we could winterize the building. Mrs. Wright asked if we could wait and then bid out for the demolition. Mr. Ruffing commented the costs will go up. Mrs. Bason commented we could get the costs to demo the building. Mr. Hagemeyer commented that the building is a stone structure and there are not many stone structures anymore. Mr. Hagemeyer wants to wait one year to look for grants. Mrs. Marriott asked if they would be paying to put the new piping in. Mr. Ruffing asked if we could open it up to public comment. Mr. Snell commented that we have a motion on the table. Mrs. Wright commented that the room is divided.

## Opened up to Public Comment

Kim McCloskey commented on the town being divided and the tax payers need to know what it costs to demo or keep the building. Jack Callahan commented he is for the 1931 structure to use it for nurse's office, resource offices, guidance office, or self-defense room. Pamela Nelson commented on "why are we rushing." She sent an email to the borough counsel and board last May asked what the guidelines are for a vacant building. Mike Luna commented that you cannot leave it and spend no money on it once they take the end off of it. Jo Shurer commented on the permits that are currently there and if that window closes. Mr. Castner responded to the comments. Jo Shurer asked what do the utilities cost and if they would be separated. Mr. Castner responded to the comments. Jo Shurer asked what it costs to insure a vacant building. Mrs. Bason responded to the comments. Jo Shurer asked what is the time frame to make a decision. Mr. Castner responded to the comments. Pamela Nelson commented on the insurance costs and suggested having a work session and not vote tonight. Kim Rehn commented the board has had time to think about what to do, please make a decision. Carrie Staron commented that a \$60 MILLION grant would be great for the area. Rachel Ulmer commented the \$60 million grant will take lots of time and there is no guarantee. Sue Snyder commented enrollment is not going up and there is no educational purpose for the 1931 building. Mrs. Bason stated no one can buy it. Sue Snyder stated it bothers her that students are very rarely brought up. Mr. Hagemeyer stated

he thinks we can find a use for the building. Mr. Ruffing responded to the comments. Mrs. Johns responded to the comments. Mrs. Wright responded to the comments.

John Klotz commented the rush is that every day the district is inefficient and the kids are suffering.

Mrs. Marriott asked how long it would take to get the figures. Mrs. Bason and Mr. Castner responded a couple weeks. Mrs. Marriott asked when they will reach the 1931 with demoing. Mr. Konkle said he was told only 30 days today. Mr. Logue commented on the rock crusher. Mr. Castner responded to the comments. Mr. Snell asked if we could call a special meeting. Mr. Snell asked if we could get costs for demo with more parking and landscaping. Mr. Castner commented said it would not have to be parking. Mrs. Bason commented to get all the costs and come back to share the costs and decide. Mr. Ruffing commented that 16 months was long enough. Mr. Snell responded to the comments. Mrs. Bason commented we have three topics that need decided: 1931, budget, and Loyalsock Valley. Mr. Ruffing commented on how it effects the budget. Mr. Konkle asked what the costs are to do this work to get the costs. Mr. Castner responded that there would be some costs.
