Current Suspension Costs \$495,572.81 including agenda items.

Copies of the S&P Global Ratings were given to the board. The school district went from an A+ to A rating.

Auditors are wrapping up their fieldwork and the board should receive a report in December.

Mr. Snell commented on change orders costs from the suspension from SEDA-COG are \$29,251.21 and change orders requested by the contractors are \$330,645.96 including change orders on the agenda.
