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Summary: The target area(s) of this award is to ensure a safe return to in person instruction and to address the opportunity gaps that existed before and were exacerbated by the pandemic. Under the Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief II Fund (ESSER II), authorized by the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations (CRRSA) Act, the Pennsylvania Department of Education (PDE) awards grants to School Districts and Charter Schools to address the impact that Novel Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) has had, and continues to have, on elementary and secondary schools across the state. The ESSERS II grant, like any federal program grant can only be awarded after it has gone through a series of federal legal and PDE reviews. Once the grant is awarded, PDE will pro-rate the distribution of funds on a monthly basis over the period of time remaining until the date of conclusion unless the district has a more immediate need. We can ask for the funds to be advanced. Such is the case with this grant. We have or will have all expenses spent by the end of 2021-2022. We have requested the funds and anticipate the full funding to be received by June or July 2022.

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Summary: The target area(s) of this award requires a significant focus on vulnerable student populations and providing equity to the most vulnerable student populations. This grant requires: 1. A 20% set aside for learning loss; 2. A focus on academic impact of lost instructional time, chronic absenteeism, student engagement and social-emotional well-being. Our district has reviewed the PDE Equity Statement and determined that our focus will be on students with chronic absenteeism, special needs students and our female student population. This grant application has been completed since the fall of 2021, however, PDE has been going through the approval process and is not yet complete. Therefore, we will not assign any expenses to this grant until we have final approval, nor will revenue be received until approval has been awarded. This grant requires the district to maintain a Health Plan that is updated at least every six month.

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Summary: In accordance with the American Rescue Plan (ARP) Act and Pennsylvania Act 24 of 2021 (Act 24), the Pennsylvania Department of Education (PDE) will award approximately \$ 249,848,000 or five percent (5%) of Pennsylvania’s ARP Elementary and Secondary School Education Relief (ESSER) State Reserve funds to school districts, charter schools and cyber charter schools (collectively, LEAs) = to implement evidence-based interventions that address learning loss in response to the academic, social, emotional and mental health needs of students and subgroups of students impacted by COVID-19 public health emergency that supplement school programs and activities. The target of this award is segregated into three portions. The district will receive \$23,772 to provide after school programs; \$23,772 to provide summer school programs and \$118,858 to provide Required Activities as follows:

30% - To address the social, emotional and mental health needs of students

10% - To provide professional development and technical assistance to educators, school support staff, school leaders and school health professionals to address the social, emotional and mental health needs of students.

8% - To address reading remediation and improvement for students

We have provided the summer and after school programs and will continue such through 2022-2023. Funds are not anticipated to be received until the conclusion of the activities.

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Summary: Under the Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief II Fund (ESSER II), authorized by the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations (CRRSA) Act, the Pennsylvania Department of Education (PDE) awards grants to School Districts and Charter Schools to address the impact that Novel Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) has had, and continues to have, on elementary and secondary schools across the state. The funding was to enhance synchronous instruction via advancements to infrastructure and or resources to bolster remote services and supports for students with complex needs and or provide services and supports to students with disabilities that evidenced a loss in skills and or behavior and/or lack of progress due to the mandatory school closures following a skill recoupment period and delivered beyond the school day. The district purchased laptops for staff who engage in delivering academic programs and KTEA 3 Brief Kits.

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Summary: This grant was authorized by the U.S. Department of the Treasury, the PA Department of Community and Economic Development and is to be used to carry out the following activities: COVID 19 related expenditures for the safe reopening of schools and to adhere to and meet the Center for Disease Control (CDC) guidelines. SEDA-Council of Governments (SEDA-COG), 201 Furnace Road, Lewisburg, PA 17837 is the designated agent for implementation, oversight, and administration of this Program. The effective dates of the program are March 1, 2020 to December 30, 2021. Lycoming County requisitions such funds on behalf of the district as the county receives the CRBG program funds. The needs assessment/application was completed prior to the date due of July 24, 2020 to Jenny Picciano, Community Development/Lead Planner. Funds were received in October 2020. The application provided allowed for funding to supply personal protection equipment, lost revenue due to cancelled events and donations and internet access and broadband deployment.
